For the week beginning 13th May, the children will be sitting the National Key Stage 2 SATs. They have all put in a great deal of effort and hard work in preparation and we want them to be able to do their very best!

Please ensure that they have some early nights throughout the week so they are in a good frame of mind and on their best form. Please also remind your child to bring in their usual stationery (no friction pens) and a water bottle. They also need to know and be able to spell their full legal names and date of birth.

We will be talking through the timetable with all the children and they be writing the days of the tests in their Home School Book. Here it is for ease of reference:

Monday 13th May English grammar, punctuation and spelling paper 1

English grammar, punctuation and spelling paper 2

Tuesday 14th May English reading

Wednesday 15th May Mathematics paper 1: arithmetic

Mathematics paper 2: reasoning

Thursday 16th May Mathematics paper 3: reasoning

Children will be seated in their own classroom or one of the halls for the tests. This week they will be told where they will be completing them.

If you child is ill on any day of the tests, please email the school office to let us know and we will be in contact with you to arrange the next steps.

All the Year 6 children will be having P.E on Tuesday, so should come to school in their P.E kit. On Monday, Wednesday & Thursday they should wear **full school uniform**.

Through discussion with the children, we have arranged for several fun activities for your child to enjoy as a celebration of their tremendous effort and achievement. Mrs Pullen is not in school on this day so 6P will have Mrs Barney with them all day.

Children have chosen three activities from the following:

- Cake-decorating competition;
- Nerf gun fight;
- Hobbies, games and gadgets;
- Gymnastics and obstacle course.

These activities will take place at throughout the morning.

For the afternoon, the children will have a picnic starting at 1pm and then a bike, scooter and sports session all together as a year group. Please can you provide a picnic for your child to enjoy rather than having a school dinner.

Your child will be able to tell you the activities that they have already chosen and they will find out this week what activities they have been allocated.

To make the day go smoothly and safely, we've included some information you need to know to prepare your child for this celebration.

ACTIVITIES

Cake-decorating Competition

For this activity, your child should bring in a **pre-baked cake or cakes** for decorating as well as any extra **decorations**, providing that they are **edible**. Please ensure that your child labels their own items. To participate in this activity, your child will need an apron or an old shirt to wear during the decorating process. The cakes will be judged at lunchtime and a prize awarded! We also suggest that they bring a container to put the cakes in to take home.

Nerf guns

Children will need to bring their own Nerf Guns and 'darts'. All children MUST wear protective eyewear for this activity e.g. goggles, glasses, face mask. Please ensure all Nerf Guns and 'darts' are clearly labelled to avoid confusion and unfortunately we can accept no responsibility for any damaged or lost items.

Hobbies, games and gadgets

If your child chooses this activity, children can opt to bring in an activity they enjoy or use those available in -school, such as crochet, Lego, art, board games, crafts, cards etc.

Children will also be allowed to bring in a tablet or handheld games console to play with and enjoy - no mobile telephones should be brought in to play with and children are not to connect to the internet or any form of social networking. Any child who attempts to use or connect to the internet via 4G on their own gadget will have it confiscated. Children will not be allowed to message each other through these gadgets. The school iPads and Chromebooks will also be available to use during this session.

Each child is responsible for the gadget they bring in. We ask that they are temporarily labelled for the day to avoid confusion and that you give your child permission to bring in a gadget by signing their Home School Book. We are arranging for a safe place for the children to leave their gadget when they are enjoying other activities.

The school accepts no responsibility for accidental loss or damage of any gadgets brought in by the children. If your child does not choose this activity then they should not bring in a gadget.

Bikes, Scooters and Sports

For this activity, children will be able to bring in a pair of roller-skates (these will be kept in their classrooms) or a scooter or bicycle to ride on the school playground if they wish. They will have a zoned area to ride in. **Children must wear helmets**. Knee-pads can be worn if you choose.

The children will be also be able to enjoy sports and games of their own in the playground using the school's PE and games equipment.
